The scripture tells us this happened 40 days after we celebrate the resurrection.

 Writing: A continued focus on a variety of texts exploring the conventions of language in context (grammar, punctuation and spelling). Focus on revising, editing and proofreading. Using correct letter formation, size and neatness. Using a variety of spelling strategies and expanding vocabulary. 	

History Places and Special Places

In Term Two, we will be continuing with our Inquiry unit of study, *The Past and the Present*.

This topic provides a study of past and present life within the context of the students' own world. Students learn about similarities and differences in family life by



comparing the present with the past. This topic also provides study of the local area and significant sites, and how they have changed over time.

Creative Arts

Visual Arts

Students will explore, observe, investigate, imagine and experiment in their own art making. They will respond to the artworks of other artists who have explored similar subject matter.



Music (Mrs Morris)

This term in Year 2 the children will continue their recorder lessons. We will also continue rhythm composing and playing these on untuned percussion instruments. The children will compose and play their own recorder piece using the notes B A G.

Personal Development/Health/ Physical Education

Moving to Stay Healthy- Students will explore the physical, social and emotional benefits of participating in physical activities. They will investigate and identify actions, contextual factors and behaviours which influence themselves and others health, safety, wellbeing and participation in physical activity.

The children will be participating in various skills and games to help prepare for the Athletics Carnival in Week 4. The children will be developing their fundamental movement skills such as walking, side sliding, running, jumping/landing, and hopping/skipping.

Living Things and Their Habitats

• Stage 1 of the Living World strand focuses on the features of living things, their environment and how they change and grow. Students research animal habitats and identify that living things live in different places that suit their needs.

They will have the opportunity to explore and answer questions through participation in guided scientific investigations, collect data from observations, and record observations using drawings, labeling and digital technologies.
