English

Children are involved in daily literacy activities that include:

- Oral language and communication
- Vocabulary
- Phonological awareness
- Phonic knowledge
- Reading fluency
- Reading comprehension
- Creating written texts
- Spelling and Handwriting
- Understanding and responding to literature

Children review each day skills and knowledge previously explored. They listen to modelled reading and partake in independent and shared reading. This term we will be revising the planning and writing of Narrative and Persuasive texts. Our school Spelling

. Bee activities will culminate in Week 4 finals.

Readers sent home will be allocated for the duration of 1-3 weeks and may consist of a variety of texts including short fiction, information texts, decodable texts and chapter books. We encourage daily home reading for 15-20 minutes aloud to build fluency and prosody. *Please ensure your child keeps their reader each day in their school bag.*

Religious Education

Throughout Term 4, there will be a focus on Presentations related to the special season of Advent. These Presentations consolidate the concept of Advent as a time of waiting and preparing for the birth of Jesus.

Through the Christmas Presentations, the children will have an opportunity to relate their experiences of waiting for Christmas. The celebration of Christmas, with biblical accounts of how Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and wise men responded to the birth of Jesus, will

provide area.



Mathematics

This term the students will be working on the following units from the syllabus areas of Number and Algebra, Statistics and Probability and Measurement and Space:

• There are many different situations where

addition, subtraction, multiplication and division can be used (for example representing whole numbers, combining and separating quantities and forming groups)



- Data, and how it is collected to solve problems
- What needs to be measured determines the unit of measure (Length and Area)
- Objects can be sorted and classified in different ways (for example 2D and 3D spatial structure)
- Problem solving using all four operations

Geography

Students will identify Australia's location in the world and explore places within Australia. They will describe connections that people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, have with places, both locally and globally. Students will



identify factors affecting people's accessibility to places and will collect and record geographical data by observing, interviewing, or using visual representations.

Personal Development/Health/ Physical Education

The children will be taking part in activities where they practice fundamental movement skills including



striking, catching, passing and hitting with equipment in minor games, with a focus on tball, cricket and Oz tag.

The P.D.H. unit is Peer Support this term. Year 6 leaders will be running mini lessons on how to be a good friend.

Japanese (Mrs. Farrugia)

This term Students will continue to develop an appreciation for Japanese culture. They will focus on the story of 'Suki's Kimono' by Chieri Uegaki, identifying the Kimono garment as a significant national dress of Japan. Students will discover 'Shichi-go-san' and will explore the traditions associated with this festival such as the importance of children wearing a kimono for the very first time. Students will recognise one of their own culturally important celebration, Christmas, noting similarities and differences between how it is celebrated in Australia and Japan. Students will be working mathematically to develop fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

Science

This term students will be exploring digital systems and their components. Students investigate how digital systems display data and use a sequence of steps and decisions (algorithm) to solve problems. They will participate in activities to develop an understanding of how digital systems use algorithms to communicate (coding), using materials, tools and equipment.
